

Configuring JSTOR collections in the ProQuest® 360 Link link resolver: a quick reference guide

The 360 Link link resolver from ProQuest is software that uses OpenURL data to provide context-sensitive item-level linking among the various online resources in a library collection. Summon, the ProQuest discovery service—and other discovery services such as Primo and EDS--uses your existing 360 Link link resolver to provide full-text linking from items in the discovery service.

Important Note: This guide has been developed to help libraries configure 360 Link to most effectively leverage their investment in content on the JSTOR platform. Please follow these guidelines carefully to ensure that all your licensed content on JSTOR is properly surfaced for your users. Our research shows that the appropriate configuration of 360 Link is an important determinant in the discoverability of the content your library licenses from JSTOR. Further, our research indicates that setting the link ordering priorities to promote JSTOR is the best way to ensure your users connect reliably to JSTOR. We encourage you to strongly consider using this option (described later in the document), as we feel it will provide a quality user experience.

To ensure effective linking to JSTOR content you will need to activate your subscribed JSTOR collections:

Activate JSTOR collections

If you already subscribe to the ProQuest A to Z product then you will likely already have configured your JSTOR collections.

Activating JSTOR collections is a 2-step process:

<u>Step 1</u>: In your ProQuest Client Center or Intota[™] profile, activate the databases to match the JSTOR collections to which you subscribe.

<u>Step 2:</u> Using the Client Center or Intota tool Offline Date and Status Editor (ODSE) activate the titles in each JSTOR collection.

Each of the JSTOR collections contains a title list

- JSTOR archive and primary source collections
 - i. As a subscriber to each of the JSTOR collections you have activated in Step 1, your users automatically have access to all titles in each collection and no further action is required.
 - ii. Using the Offline Date and Status Editor (ODSE) in the Client Center or Intota, activate the titles in any JSTOR collection your users do <u>not</u> automatically have access to all titles.
- Books at JSTOR collection and Current Scholarship Program (CSP) journal collection
 - i. For these collections you will have to use the Client Center tool ODSE to activate the titles selectively, according to your institutional title holdings.
 - ii. If you license the complete collection, your users automatically have access to all titles in each collection and no further action is required.
 - iii. If you only subscribe to a few titles in each collection, search for them in your collection's title list and activate them individually. If you subscribe to many, but not all titles, you can select the option to Add All Titles and then selectively change those to which you do not subscribe to Not Tracked. Alternatively, you can activate titles based on a file you prepare of subscribed titles.
 - iv. For these collections, new titles added by JSTOR will not automatically be activated in your profile. If you subscribe to additional titles from these collections you must individually activate all new titles.

Configure your 360 Link full-text options

For a single item (article, book, book chapter, etc.) there may be multiple valid targets to retrieve the full text. The default order of priority for display of the full text links in a 360 Link menu screen is alphabetic, e.g. EBSCO, JSTOR, Project Muse.

If in your 360 Link Administration Console you have selected the 1-click option to bypass the menu screen, (or if your library uses the enhanced 360 Link with

Index-Enhanced Direct Linking), then the default order for linking is also alphabetic. In the example shown, the default link will be to the EBSCO version of the full text.

If you would prefer the JSTOR version in all cases, then change the order of priority using the Database Order page in the 360 Link Administration Console. Additional information is available in the support article 360 Link: Administration Console – Database Order in the <u>ProQuest Support Center</u>.

Activate JSTOR collections in your discovery service

If you are using Summon as your discovery service, then no further action is required. If, however, you are using an indexed-based library discovery tool from another provider such as Ex Libris's Primo or EBSCO's EDS, then:

- a. Ensure all subscribed JSTOR collections are activated for your discovery service.
- b. Ensure your holdings as configured in 360 Core are "published" for use by your discovery service. For details on this, see the JSTOR quick reference guide for your discovery service.

* Public Library Collections

- Collection I includes all <u>Arts & Sciences collections</u> and the <u>Business</u> IV Collection.
- Collection II includes all archival Life Sciences content on JSTOR (including the Life Sciences Collection and the Ecology & Botany II Collection).
- Collection III includes all primary source collections on JSTOR: Global Plants, Struggles for Freedom in Southern Africa, African Cultural Heritage Sites and Landscapes, and 19th-Century British Pamphlets.

^{**} Early Journal Content is not actually a JSTOR collection. In 2011, JSTOR made journal content published prior to 1923 in the United States, and prior to 1870 elsewhere, freely available to anyone, anywhere in the world. See http://about.jstor.org/service/early-journal-content-0.

***Discipline packages of Current Scholarship titles

- In 2011-2013, JSTOR sold collections of Current Scholarship titles aligned to the Arts & Sciences I through XII Archive Collections. JSTOR no longer offers these collections. Discovery partners may retain these as targets if this helps their customers.
- JSTOR continues to offer Current Scholarship titles grouped by discipline.

**** The following JSTOR Primary Source Collections have not yet been made available by JSTOR for indexing by ProQuest:

- African Cultural Heritage Sites and Landscapes
- Global Plants (formerly JSTOR Plant Sciences)
- Struggles for Freedom in South Africa

By taking advantage of Summon's Database Recommendation and Best Bets tools, you can make these collections discoverable in Summon even though they aren't yet available for indexing by ProQuest.

*****The Sustainability Collections Sets are not comprised of books with publication dates from a given year or given set of years. For example, Sustainability I might have a book with a publication date of 2005. For all other collections (except Sustainability 2), all the books in the set have the publications year or years that are in the name of the set.

******This is not the name of an actual collection, just a convenient target for libraries who mass order Books at JSTOR.

- 1) There is no product called "JSTOR Complete", but some providers add it as a target for the convenience of librarians. We recommend that it not be used, since there is no simple way to define what products would be covered by this label.
- 2) JSTOR also offers several information services for individuals, which can be seen at http://about.jstor.org/individuals. None of these offerings should appear in partners' linking and discovery services.
